REFLECTIONS FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

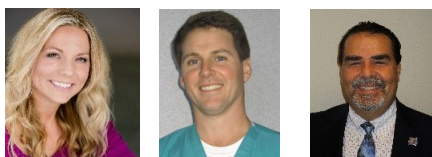

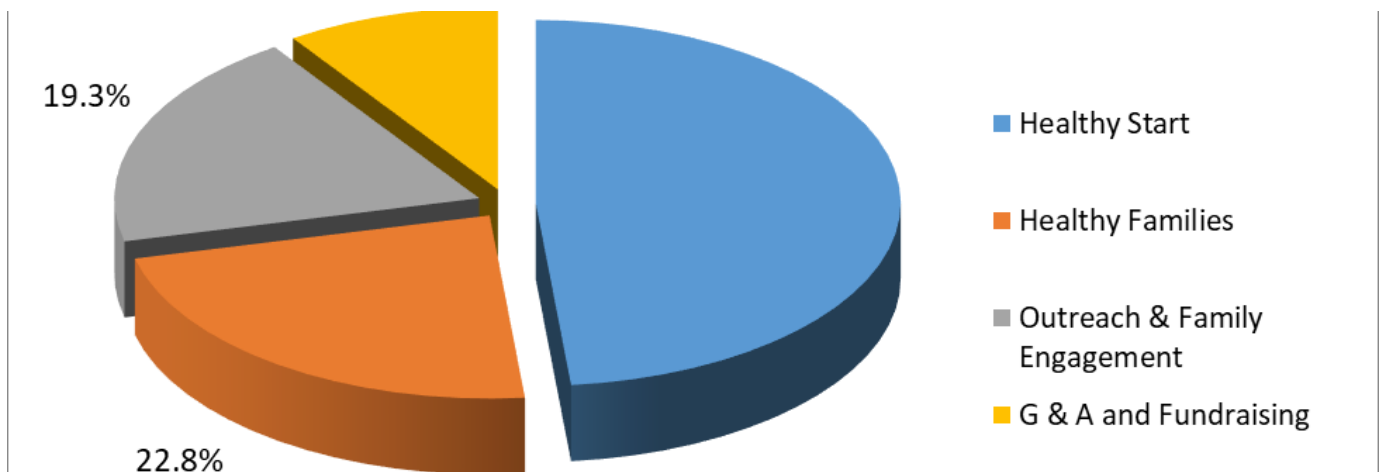
REFLECTING ON OUR FISCAL HEALTH

FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019

The Healthy Start Coalition convenes a volunteer Finance and Audit Oversight Committee that reviews the budget, quarterly financial statements, and annual audited financial statements. Recommendations from this committee are presented to the Board of Directors and Coalition staff to continuously improve operational processes and maintain exemplary fiscal accountability. The FY18/19 audited financial statements are available on our website.

90.6% of the Coalition's total FY18/19 expenditures of 2.8 million dollars were for program services. In addition to funding Healthy Start services for pregnant women, moms, babies and their families, FY18/19 Healthy Start funds also:

- Leveraged over **\$1.3 million dollars** in additional and match funding for related program services;
- Leveraged **\$138,886** in cash and in-kind contributions and provider match;
- Funded over **60** full time employees in our Healthy Start and Healthy Families Programs;
- Brought over **200** community constituents together to participate in our service delivery and Board activities.

REFLECTING ON OUR MOMS AND BABIES



PRENATAL SCREEN

- 92.23% - Women who consented to the prenatal screen

INFANT SCREEN

- 95.65% - Infants who received a Healthy Start screen



PREGNANCY MEDICAID—58% of Pregnant Women in our area receive Medicaid

- **2,003** women who qualified received Healthy Start services
- **100%** served were connected to WIC and offered Healthy Start



HEALTHY START

- **6,154** women and infants received Healthy Start Services
- **2,251** received care coordination or home visiting services
- **530** families received face to face parenting services in the home



INTENSIVE SERVICES—Women and babies with exceptional behavioral health need

- **490** women and infants received outreach and intervention services
- **100%** had a screen or referral completed
- **87%** consented to Neonatal Outreach Services
- **97%** had verified attempt to contact within 72 hours of discharge



REFLECTING ON OUR FAMILIES



HEALTHY FAMILIES

Healthy Families is a nationally accredited, community based, voluntary home visitation program proven to prevent child abuse and neglect through promoting positive parent- child relationships and child health and development.

- **140** families received home visiting services.
- **Target Children = 130 and Non-Target Children = 131 Completed Home Visits = 2,027**
- **No Verified Findings of Child Maltreatment**
- **After Program Completion = 100%**
- **During Program Participation = 99%**
- **Participant Retention = 88% Referrals = 332**
- **Participant Self-Sufficiency = 92%**



FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

The Healthy Start Coalition is dedicated to the continuous development of leadership among our family participants and our community. We create positive spaces to build relationships, promote a voice for families, and share our experience and strength to strengthen the future for our children.

- 903 individuals received services at the Family Place
- 172 individuals received Family Engagement Services
- 31 Parent Cafes were facilitated by family representatives
- 281 new members joined the Family Place
- 15 Family Engagement Training Events were presented to community partners
- 9 Family Engagement Advisory Board Meetings were convened to address system changes

REFLECTING ON OUR COMMUNITIES

FETAL INFANT MORTALITY REVIEW (FIMR)



The FIMR Project of Healthy Start is based on an evidence-based model developed by the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ACOG). During this last year, our Case Review Team reviewed 28 cases of infant death and fetal loss. These reviews result in community action aimed at improving our maternal and child health system of care. The volunteer Case Review Team (CRT) is comprised of medical experts, consumers, law enforcement, the faith and social service communities.

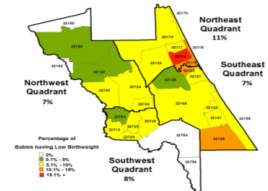
LIFESONG



One of the recommendations from the Fetal and Infant Mortality Review was to develop collaborative activities with the African American Faith Community. In concert with local pastors and church leaders, we work to inspire people to become aware about infant and family health and well-being through narration, art, song, dance, and music. Healthy Start distributes materials to over 100 churches annually.

HEALTH EQUITY IN PLACE -BASED MODELS

As a joint effort with assistance from the National League of Cities, (NLC), the National Association of Counties (NaCo), the Center for the Study of Social Policy (CSSP), CityMatCH, the Florida Department of Health in Volusia County, and Helena Girouard, Pritzker Fellow with One Voice for Volusia's thrive by 5 collaborative, our Coalition has approached health equity through the use of data, relationship-building, review of Best Practices, and research, to address health disparities in infant mortality and low birth weight using place based focus. Throughout the 2018-2019 fiscal year, we concentrated on data collection in two specific areas of Volusia County with the intent of expansion in our two county service area. We thank partners who have contributed to our ongoing development of this project to include: The Daytona Beach Housing Authority, the Department of Children and Families, the Daytona Beach Police Department, Bethune-Cookman University Masters Program in Public Health, Mid-Florida Community Services, and the City of Daytona Beach. We will use a reflective approach in public health—PDSA, or Plan Do, Study, Act, to measure specific interventions over time.
